#### School Fees

School Fees this year are \$49 for each child. As we are a Public School, our school fees are voluntary, however they do help to cover costs of classroom resources. It would be greatly appreciated if school fees could be paid by the end of Term 1 through the office.

#### Attendance

Positive attendance at school is critical to a child's success. NSW law states that children must be in attendance at school every day. If your child is absent, you need to explain the absence within seven days. You can explain absences through:

- 1. Phoning the office
- 2. Responding to the automatically generated letters which are sent out each Friday or;
- 3. Using the SkoolBag App

If you have any questions about this, please contact the office.

#### Student Health

Have your child's health needs changed over the school break? It is important that the school has up-to-date information about student health needs. Allergies and other medical conditions need to be managed by the school. Please contact the school if you need to update our school records.

#### **Class Meetings and Parent Interviews**

An opportunity to meet your child's teacher has been organised for Wednesday 13th February. Please refer to the already published note to find your child's class meeting time. Following from these meetings will be picnic on the bottom flat. Games will be set up and families are invited to bring chairs, a rug and picnic items in a chance to get to know each other and our staff.

One on one parent teacher interviews will be occurring in Week 9 Term 1. More information about these interviews will be published shortly. It is hoped that these interviews will give more information about how your child is progressing and coping with the demands of the curriculum.

If parents require a more formal interview and extended meeting before the end of Term 1, then parents should phone the office to make an interview time. Morning periods are very busy. Teachers are unable to meet with parents at 9:00am as rolls need to be marked and lessons started for the day.


#### Getting On Track In Time (Got It!)

Glendale East Public School has the opportunity to participate in an exciting program for children in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 in Terms 1 and 2, 2019. *Getting On Track In Time* (**Got It!**) is an early intervention program run by local health professionals from the Local Health District in collaboration with Education.

**Got It!** aims to teach children emotional resilience and further the development of their social skills to help them better manage their behaviours at school and at home, assisting them to learn to their full potential and maximise their life opportunities. The program will be fun and supportive for students and will also be practical for parents and teachers.

#### Message from the Office

Just a reminder that all money for all upcoming events MUST be returned to the office prior to the **due by date as noted on notes**. The office cannot accept any further payments after this date. **Cash** payments can be left after 3pm and will be receipted the next day, however we cannot give change after 3pm.

#### Eftpos cannot be processed after

NO Uniform eftpos transactions can be made through the office. Correct amount of cash can be left in an envelope addressed to the uniform shop.

#### Department of Education Visitors sign on requirements

All visitors to the school site are reminded to please sign on and off in the office visitors book every time you visit between the hours of 9am to 3pm for a specific purpose for example; meeting with teacher, purchasing uniforms, parent helpers, canteen helpers etc. This does NOT include assemblies.

# Transporting students by private vehicles on school business.

From time to time, it is necessary for our students to be transported by private vehicle. Parents who volunteer to transport students are reminded the following documentation is required:

- Parent Driver Declaration Form
- a copy of the current Vehicle Registration
- A copy of a current Drivers Licence
- Appendix 5 Form
- 100 Points of Identification

Please provide this information to the office prior to the Excursion if you have agreed to transport students by private vehicle. This will assist our school to comply with Department of Education Procedures.

#### **Medications**

As a general rule, the school does not administer non-prescribed medications. If medication is required during school hours, then it must be approved by the Principal. Parents/carers must complete a medication form if a child requires a specific medication or ongoing health management. A letter from the prescribing doctor will be required.

#### Messages for Students

We respectfully ask that you discuss with your children prior to the school day the arrangements for the afternoon. This will help minimise interruptions to classes in getting messages to children.

Linking people and communities with opportunities



The safety and wellbeing of our children is paramount. As parents and carers we can't always be with our children to advise and protect them.

When out and about, children can be confronted with situations where good decision-making is vital. With this in mind, advising our children with appropriate responses to certain situations will help them avoid trouble and danger.

Here are some simple tips to give your children for when they are out and about.

#### Protect your child walking home

- ALWAYS identify safe places on the way home from school.
- DO NOT stop and talk to people you don't know. Go straight home or to your intended destination.
- ALWAYS find a safe place if you feel frightened. These include schools, shops, churches or police/fire/ambulance stations and tell them that you are frightened.
- **NEVER** get into a car with someone you don't know.

#### Protect your child on public transport

- **NEVER** travel in isolated areas. Find crowded carriages, guard's compartment (marked with a blue light) or at the front of the bus.
- **ALWAYS** try to travel in groups of friends if possible.

#### Protect your child when in public spaces

- ALWAYS carry a contact number for your parents. (On a card attached to your clothing, written on your arms or in your phone).
- **DO NOT** walk away from family or friends without telling them where you are going, when you'll be back and who you are with.
- ALWAYS walk away from fights or arguments, unpleasant or aggressive behaviour and take your friends with you.
- REMEMBER, always tell your parents, carer or teacher if something has happened.

# SAFETY around schools



## ROAD RULES IN SCHOOL ZONES:

#### Pedestrian crossings

You cannot stop within 20 metres before a pedestrian crossing or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking. *Minimum penalty: \$439 and two demerit points* 

#### **Double parking**

You may not stop on the road alongside to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers. *Minimum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points* 

#### Parking on a verge

You cannot stop or park on a verge area (footpath, nature strip, dividing strip or kerb). *Minimum penalty: \$183 and two demerit points* 

#### PARKING RESTRICTION SIGNS



#### You cannot stop here

A driver must not stop in a no stopping zone.

Minimum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points



#### You can stop here for two minutes only

You have no more than two minutes to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and the driver must stay within three metres of the vehicle.

Minimum penalty: \$183 and two demerit points



#### You cannot stop here

You are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus.

Minimum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points



#### You cannot stop here

Unless a current Mobility Parking Scheme (MPS) permit is displayed.


Minimum penalty: \$549 and one demerit point
